TQIP Mortality Reporting System Work Group Overview

The TQIP Mortality Reporting System is an online anonymous reporting system for mortality cases with opportunity for improvement. The purpose of the program is to use emblematic cases that identify latent safety threats or systems gaps that may lead to preventable mortality within trauma centers, and to use lessons learned from those cases to disseminate mitigation strategies. All centers can learn from these rare events and implement evidence-based mitigation strategies using the hierarchy of interventions effectiveness framework to identify systems-level solutions. As of early 2023, there are more than 600 cases that have been submitted to the TQIP Mortality Reporting System.

The work group meets quarterly via Zoom to review case submissions (pre-screened and filtered prior to the meeting by the work group lead and selected volunteers), identify themes, and select cases for dissemination. Dyads of early career and experienced work group members select cases to primarily analyze and write up for peer-reviewed publication and/or oral presentation at the annual TQIP meeting Mortality Work Group session. Asynchronous review of writeups is completed between quarterly meetings by work group members. All work group members are expected to review, revise, and contribute to each case analysis and mitigation strategy development.

TQIP Mortality Reporting System Work Group General Responsibilities

This position functions as a work group lead; please refer to the general expectations/requirements for the work group lead position.

TQIP Mortality Reporting System Work Group Specific Responsibilities

- Provide strategic direction for the project, including delegating the [write-up of case studies](#) and planning an annual session at the TQIP Conference (if requested).
- Reviewing submitted mortality cases for future case studies devised and written by the workgroup.
- Serve as the Surgeon Lead to provide workgroup updates to ACS COT leadership and committees including the PIPS Committee and the COT Quality Pillar.
- Work with ACS staff to maintain project documentation, repository of produced work products, and any future revisions to the data collection tool.
- Serve as corresponding author for Journal of Trauma case report submissions, including collating writeups and CME questions and responding to editorial queries.



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
