Work Group Focus

The project objectives are to develop a performance improvement process for MCI based on best practices of the disaster After Action Review (AAR) process in the context of the trauma system Performance Improvement and Patient Safety (PIPS) principles and, determine the metrics needed to track and support the proposed process.

The workgroup will be tasked to 1) review best practices of the disaster After Action Review (AAR) process in the context of the trauma system Performance Improvement and Patient Safety (PIPS) principles, 2) use the findings of the review to draft a mass casualty incident (MCI) performance improvement process, 3) determine the metrics needed to track and support the proposed MCI process vs. what is currently collected through the NTDS, and 4) present recommendations to Systems Pillar Chair and staff, who will bring forward to the COT Executive Committee.

- Recommend metrics based on review of information currently collected through NTDS

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
